

D7.2. Policy Development Workshops with public authorities

Executive Summary

D7.2. Policy Development Workshops with public authorities represents one of the deliverables achieved within Work Package 7 “Policy Development and Scalability”.

Each country partner in the ProW project has carried out 1-2 policy development workshops. The purpose of the policy development workshops was to ensure that project findings are scaled and they influence policy.

To reach this purpose, the agenda of the workshops included a variety of ProW-related topics: the presentation of the project application, the ProW intervention itself and the results of this intervention, research reports - such as Literature Review and Needs Assessment reports, or field trials reports (i.e. the Implementation Reports), and also *hands-on* sessions to support the participants to access the ProW eLearning platform and the Mobile Learning, or to join the Teacher Wellbeing and Career Observatory (TWCO) and take the TWCO 2023 Survey. Each of these workshops paid a special attention to presenting the main project deliverable on sustainability and scalability, that is “D7.1. Exploitation plan, scalability and policy recommendations”, with its set of recommendations for policy makers and practitioners.

The number of participants who attended these workshops is relevant and justifies the high impact of the project. The participants to these workshops were experts, policy makers and public authorities.

Some of the policy development workshops have been implemented face-to-face, other online, in order to gather as many as possible representatives of authorities who to be able to ensure not only the project’s scalability, but also who can have an effective contribution in the policy change and in valorising ProW policy recommendations, in the near future.
